6.3Quality improvement strategies adoptedby the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As we are an affiliated college, we have to follow the curriculum of the University. But 05 of our faculty members are members of board of studies & they contribute by giving valuable suggestions in the meetings of the BOS.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Along with the formal black-board & lecture method we are also using ICT in teaching and learning. We organize remedial classes, class room seminar, project work & also distribute reading materials & model answers to the students. LCD is being regularly used in PG teaching.

Being an affiliated college, the institution follows' the annual examination system of the University in UG & semester system in PG. The college takes unit test, quarterly test, half yearly test and pre-annual test for internal evaluation of the students

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

Various facilities are provided to the teaching staff for research & development like: -Research advisory committee, Internet facility, library facility & office assistance.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

All the teaching staffs are engaged in a number of activities through various committees along with their teaching assignment. As the office is also facing shortage of staff, teachers are engaged in various office works like checking of admission forms, examination forms, books of account, scholarship forms, transfer certificate issue work, letter drafting etc. Some employees of class IV are also appointed from our own financial resources to help the office management. In this way we try to utilize our human resources as much as possible.

Regular recruitment of faculty is done by the state government however; the college appoints teachers on temporary basis for the academic session as per the guidelines of the state govt.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

Although the guidelines of admission in various courses run by the college is decided by the higher education department, Govt. of Chhattisgarh, yet we try to maintain quality in admission of students. A list of students seeking admission in various courses is prepared according to merit list and as per the state government's reservation policy. The admission procedure and other information are displayed at the notice board and are regularly updated. The in-charge committees of admission to various courses complete the whole admission process like checking of documents, verifying eligibility etc. and the office staff maintains the records of the admitted students. Quality of students in admission is often compromised as the area is slightly lagging in quality school education.
